January:

John Tessin welcomed Katherine Clarke as 2025 Director of Intermountain HOG by performing the traditional passing of the vest. All prior directors in attendance stood for this activity.

Dennis (HOG Manager) thanked members for the representation at Celebration of Life for Walter. He went on to provide an update for the dealership. He stated that the dealership has sold a total of 1014 bikes for 2024. Ride 365 ended the year with the chapter being 1st in region & 13th in nation with 932,446 miles. He congratulated high mileage riders, Kathy Anderson 26,506, Brett Allies with 26,489 & Jamie Allies with 24,317.

Katherine (Director) raised the topic of Regional Officer Connection (ROC) for 2025. SLC location; This year the event is February 22 in Salt Lake City with travel days of the 21st & 23rd. Room pricing is \$179 a room. Approved motion to attend ROC up to 5 people for 2 nights with 2 rooms each night. Participants are Katherine, Mia (Secretary), Marcia (Activities), Bob (Assistant Director), and Justin (Safety).

Mark (Webmaster) recommended all correspondence copied to HOG Gmail as well as sent to personal email of recipient as there is job sharing that occurs. Approved

Katherine (Director) provided an ACCP Update – 129 participants signed up. Forty-four chicken, 33 salmon & 52 tri-tip meals selected. The hotel allows use of room and bar area downstairs for organizers so bring your snacks. Event room opens at 11:00 am for decoration committee.

Katherine (Director) announced her Director's Challenge. Members must visit any city in the state of Idaho that start with H, O, or G. There are 31 cities.

Katherine (Director) and Bob (Asst. Director) on B.A.D. Video Call. Received update on North meets South rally and provided an update on R2P. Discussion regarding a "Slingshot" participating in the rides. The decision was made to go behind sweep.

Shannon (Editor) and Brett (Lead Road Captain) are creating a RSVP-type Google Doc for Road Captains to use when requesting and managing rides and for the Calendar Build meeting on March 2nd. Brett went on to brief all ride communications go through him. He described the new process to announce rides and how the road captain will get the ride roster prior to the ride.

Dawn (Membership) announced New Member Orientation scheduling is in process. Will be meeting with Brian (Learn to Ride) to select dates. Katherine (Director) recommended we do three; one in April, June, and September.

Debra (out-going Secretary) lead discussion on how bylaws address chapter actions for bereavement recognition.

Motion made and approved to purchase voice recorder for secretary.

Shannon (Editor) provided review of Christmas Gift Wrapping. Pairing new and seasoned members worked well. Name tags are a big hit & will reorder for next year.

Marcia (Activities) already has a schedule for the year and working with Hannah (HDHD Events).

John Tessin (R2P) provided update. Two hundred tickets sold. Looking to negotiate pricing with other hotels close by. John will be out of pocket until April. Shanny (Editor) will keep me in the loop and be the spokesperson during absence.

General Meeting:

Dennis (HOG Manager) gave an update on Ride 365. We ended last year # 1 of 68 in the Region and # 13 in the Nation. For 2025, currently 42 members signed up. Come in and get a free safety inspection. Dennis provided a 15% discount coupon for the purchase of an HD Vehicle Hill Hold Control kit. Beat Dennis Ride Challenge begins February 1st, ending March 31st. Text Dennis if interested.

Katherine (Director) introduced the 2025 new and returning board members. She went on to thank ACCP committee members and volunteers. The 2025 Director Challenge was announced. Members must visit the 31 cities in Idaho that start with the letter H, O, or G. List on the website.

Lane (ICMS) provided a legislative Update: Right to preserve Internal Combustion Engines. IDL H20 amends existing law to revise provisions regarding covering certain loads to prevent spillage and to provide a notification requirement. Other ICMS Interests are: Increased penalty for distracted driving, the profiling bill & lane filtering.

Brett (Lead Road Captain) announced the Annual Road Captain interest meeting this Sunday (Feb 1), at HDHD. There will be introduction to the new automated ride scheduling procedures.

Wayne (Food Safety) announced he was looking for a replacement for the position. He went on to announce there are eight pancake breakfasts and eight, 8 burger burns scheduled for the year.

Jamie (Member at Large) announced there are two membership events scheduled. One in May and another in September.

February:

Dennis (HOG Manager) briefed a meeting with Hannah (Marketing HDHD) resulted in a request to collaborate on email blasts. It was agreed HOG will send out authorized and reviewed HDHD event blast to HOG membership on behalf of the dealership. Discussion regarding Mark Dukes (Sponsor) collaborating with HOG monthly newsletter to include events that HDHD hold. Handbook research indicates that Intermountain HOG Chapter can advertise awareness for High Desert Harley Davidson originated events. Third party events will not be included in the awareness campaigns. Safety Gift Card eligibility is inclusive of any department safety gear purchased at HDHD. Provide proof of purchase to Dennis (HOG Manager) and he will update the eligibility list. There is a list of approved items that is held by Justin (Safety).

Greg (Treasurer) briefed the 990N tax reporting for 2024 was submitted and accepted by the IRS. The ACCP was a success and under budget at \$12,000. He announced the 2025 proposed budget holds tracking information for R2P but is not included in the total budget. Board discussed how to handle HOG rides that provides a surprise meal gift to participants. Bob (Assistant Director) will take the lead on this and report back to the board.

Katherine (Director) briefed on the following topics: Collaborative Leadership announced and defined.

Regional Officer Connection (ROC) Update – six people going and renting a vehicle for all to travel together - happening February 22, 2025.

Mark Dukes Business meeting included Katherine Clarke, Bob Anderson and Dennis Peck – all is good- it was a love fest.

2025 ACCP Review/Survey Results – Katherine provided a YOY comparison for 2024 & 2025. Discussion on survey results – likes, dislikes, comments and suggestions. Volunteer cards will be sent out soon.

B.A.D. Video Call – Greg, Bob & Katherine.

Breakfast Donation Charity 2025 – A motion was passed to sponsor Meals on Wheels again this year.

Accident Scene Management – Trina is opening to give training again this year. Need 10 people to buy in. Justin will be the lead on the email blast for interest.

Chapter Generic Business Cards – Ordered 300 cards with QR code & meeting information for R2P & handout to general public.

Bob (Assistant Director) Recommended to call new members to the front for intro and photo to save time. He also proposed adding position of Sergeant at Arms during his term next year. After discussion, proposal tabled.

Brett (Lead Road Captain) briefed on upcoming Road Captain Calendar Build Meeting scheduled for Sunday, March 2nd upstairs in the conference room at High Desert. Road Captain Ride Request Process Update was a success. Requests sent to the Lead Road Captain for approval. Thank you, Shannon (Editor) for your assistance.

General Meeting: Sannon (Editor) provided update for R2P: sold 329 of 350 tickets. Clothing is available. April 5 is the deadline to purchase merchandise and tickets. March 1st rides signup is available. Fourteen rides a day during the event. Volunteer list of events and help needed are found with Shannon.

March:

Regional Officer Connection (ROC) update by participants

Bob (Asst Director) described the learning environment. The two main takeaways were the relationship with the dealership to maintain a cohesive environment. Second was the discussion of how to bring younger members to our local HOG environment. Bob also explained a pocket booklet handed out that provided QR codes for important topics.

Marcias (Activities) main emphasis is to remember to ride your own ride. Great conference. The speaker, Chris, was engaging. Grateful for the relationship with the dealership. Dealership relationships and nuances.

Justin (Safety) discussed his engagement with the other Safety Officers at ROC. Recognition and thanks given to Brett Allies (previous Safety Officer) for the library of amazing resources available to share with other Safety Officers.

Shannan (Member at Large) provided a summary of topics covered. Focusing on the fair, honest, positive & creative aspect that was conveyed during the conference. Also, the message “If you are not having fun, you are doing something wrong”. When dealing with challenges within the organization, over communicate with other members to keep open

lines of transparency. There was discussion about diminishing membership. Lastly, during communications don't get angry just make change. A distinct observation was that the HOG Chapter is an extension of their local dealership. Some HOG chapters can be very demanding in the dealership relationship. Lastly, if there is a challenge that is not in the handbook, then probably should not be doing it.

Katherine (Director) explained how we broke into groups based on our position held in the chapter. The time was limited so the interaction was more direct, we got to the heart of the discussions. Some statistics shared were there are 1m members of National HOG worldwide; 400k are in the US. The number of HOG Chapter members is 80k. The emphasis is getting people in, retaining them and getting new people to join. The HOG Manager (Dennis) is the liaison between the dealership and the local HOG chapter.

Katherine (Director) briefed that some of the volunteer cards may be left over from last year. We will go through them and remove all the cards from last year only leaving the wrapping and ACCP cards.

Katherine (Director) briefed Trina (Accident Scene Management Trainer) is our speaker at the March General Meeting. She may give a class if there is interest. The cost is \$100/per person. Discussion on the class location is still in progress.

Katherine (Director) that updates were made to the trifold flyer for the Intermountain HOG Chapter. They went dormant for a period. They will be available in the chapter box area at the dealership. The salespeople may not discuss HOG with new buyers as they may not know about HOG. Looking for Ideas on how we can inform and distribute HOG Chapter membership informational trifolds to visitors at High Desert Harley Davidson dealership.

Bob (Asst Director) last meeting there was a request to engage a committee to work details on surprise meal rides. The committee is Bob Anderson, Jamie (Member at Large) and Greg (Treasurer). At the next meeting the committee will submit their proposal to the board on the ride and funding.

Bob (Asst Director) briefed the 2026 ACCP is confirmed; Nampa Civic Center on January 10th, 2026. A \$500 deposit was issued yesterday, March 3rd.

Brett (Lead Road Captain) Katherine (Director) provided the Chapter Ride Protocol & Recommendations to board members last week. Tomorrow morning, March 5th, the document will be sent out to the general membership via email blast by Mark (Webmaster). Shanny (Editor) will put it into the Newsletter this month, and Brett will distribute at the General Membership meeting. Brett shared an excerpt from the document, "we as a HOG Chapter represent the dealership and when we are wearing our patches make sure you ride accordingly".

Shannon (Editor) provided R2P update. Tickets sold, 341. We will be allowing 365 to sign up then registration will close. Merchandise sales are ongoing. Katherine (Director) mentioned the event ride rosters are being populated and going as planned.

Wayne (Food Safety) the Dept of Health has accepted our Food application, and we now have our permit. Currently, no one has reached out to take over the Food Safety position.

Anna Anderson – Photo Contest

Anna (Asst Photographer) introduced a new photo contest for the 2025 riding season.... Picture this... A Biker's Chronicles, a monthly photo contest running throughout the 2025 riding season! Each month, members can submit a photo based on a new theme and compete for bragging rights. This is a fun way to share your rides, your views, and your favorite moments on the road. General Meeting:

Trina Michaelis (Accident Scene Management Instructor) provided overview of class information. Cost is \$100 for the 8-hour course. We will need a minimum of 10 attendants. Work in Progress – collaboration with Lane of ICMS and the ID Dept of Transport for support to offer free classes.

Justin (Safety Officer) briefed about safety program drawings. To be eligible for the drawing, purchase safety gear or a safety check through the HD H-D service dept with Dennis (HOG Manager).

Lane (IMCS) provided update on Legislator bills – HB 20 load covers, going nowhere; HB 23 extension of mc instructional permits from 6 months to 1 year; HB 205 exceed speed while passed as of July 1st; Amended HB 531 Driver training is now turned over to parents goes into effect July 1st. Senate bill 1100 on mc profiling not going anywhere; lane filtering bill went nowhere. Funding for ACM training is in progress for 2026.

Shared details of accident data in relation to lane filtering. A report is coming together. The 40th annual Coalition for MC Awareness Rally on May 3rd, 2025

Shannon (Editor) provided update on R2P. April 5th is the deadline for tickets and merchandise. Registration and merch purchase on the website, Rockies2Pacific.com

April:

Katherine (Director) led discussions on following topics:

Providing volunteer cards for hours worked TBD with R2P. Approved

Where Trifold Flyers will be available at HDHD.

Generic business cards – Discussion with pricing and possible options for printing. Prototype is with HD H-D Brett for approval.

Accident Scene Management class discussion with details and optional dates and times.

Bob (Assistant Director) details for choosing ride for Surprise Free Ride Meal. One ride will be chosen out of a hat from all scheduled day rides. Result will be held secretly between Bob, Greg (Treasurer) and Jamie (Member at Large) and will only be announced on the day of the chosen ride. Approved additional budget up to \$750.

ACCP Theme planning meeting on the 23rd at Bob and Anna's home.

Mason (Historian) as a follow up to a previous discussion about raising meal prices during chapter burger burns, a cost-per-meal calculation was made based on current supplies prices. Even with recent price increases in grocery items, we're paying approx. \$3.50 per meal that we charge \$8 for. It was decided to leave our price at \$8 for now.

General Meeting:

Dennis (HOG Manager) announced a Patriot thunder incentive by Mark (Sponsor) awarding \$1k for the riding group/club with the most member participation.

John Tessin (Chapter Member) provides R2P update. April 5th is the deadline for tickets and merchandise. Registration and merch purchase on the website, Rockies2Pacific.com. 361 people registered. Event dates are June 19th – 22nd. Projected 35 Chapters

Jamie (Member at Large) briefed the Spring Picnic will be at Bear Creek Park, Meridian on May 18th. RSVP by May 12 via the ride calendar or with Shanny (Editor) tonight after the meeting.

May:

Katherine (Director) briefed on the following topics:

Accident Scene Management Training, waiting for Trina for the signup sheets for July 13th and August 3rd. Motion passed to pay 50, per training day, to Eagles Lodge for use of meeting room.

Feed the HOG (Suggestion Box):

Recommendation to participate in Adopt a Highway program. Discussion tabled for more information.

Hand Signals a waste of time. Hand signals will continue for safety.

When pulling out of group, use flashers. Tabled for further review.

There was a comment regarding an off-color joke presented to membership. Jokes will be kept out of meeting agenda in the future.

Herb (Member at Large) briefed Spring picnic has a great signup. A self-paying poker ride is being discussed. Motion to add \$2,500 to MAL budget for free chapter events was approved.

General Meeting:

Bob (Asst Director) asked for six volunteers to direct traffic for 4 hours during Patriot Thunder.

Katherine (Director) announced Henry (husband of chapter member Mary Clark) was selected for National Honor Flight (privately funded organization that transports veterans to Washington DC, at no cost, to visit war memorials). He is leaving June 15th. Card sent around for all to sign.

Herb Weston for Lane Triplett thanked the membership for the strong support on May 3rd for the 40th annual IMCS Rally.

June:

Katherine (Director) briefed on the following topics:

North Meet South summary from attendees Kathy (Member at Large), Mason (Historian) and Katherine. Next year N meets S will be held in Oregon.

Accident Scene Management – the sign up will be sent to the whole chapter this next week.

Volunteer Cards – Art (Equipment) provided cards to the crew for roadside cleanup as part of a ride.

John Tessin (Chapter Member) provided R2P Update. He stated plans are on track. A discussion arose about people jumping in on a ride they didn't sign up for. It was determined they would follow behind the rides sweep. June 12th ride sign-up information will be going out to registrants.

Jeff D'Agostino (Photographer) announced Jamie (Member at Large) won the photo contest for May.

General Meeting:

Dennis (HOG Manager) briefed on Ride 365. Our chapter is 2nd in the region & 25th in the nation.

Katherine (Director) briefed we currently do not have enough people enrolled for Accident Scene Management Class. The class has been opened to the public. If we do not get 10 participants, the fee will be refunded.

Directors Challenge – Katherine Clarke

Katherine (Director) briefed on the Director's Challenge. A picture of the Post Office would be fine, just stay safe. The prize could be considered an heirloom.

Cheryl (Chapter Member) provided recap of Rockies 2 Pacific Event. Three hundred fifty-four people attended. Chapters represented were 32 from 15 states. Ketchikan AK 1200 miles & OK 1409 miles one way for the longest riders. Most attendees tied at 37, Great North WA & Great Salt Lake UT. Our chapter provided 73 amazing volunteers. Brett (Lead Road Captain) reported there were no accidents. We led 16 rides over 2 days; 313 bikes and trikes rode 56,700 miles managed by 25 road captains. All pre-rides and route maps were put together by Brett & Jamie (Member at Large). Next year's event will be held in Marysville, WA July 15-19, 2025.

Herb (Member at Large) briefed the group for Lane Triplett (ICMS). Lane thanks the chapter for the strong support on May 3rd for the 40th annual IMCS Rally.

Anna (Ass. Photographer) briefed on the July photo contest. "Behind Bars (handlebars that is)! Dates: July 1 – July 27. Email your entry by July 28th at 11:59pm. Judges will vote between July 29 through August 1. The winner will be announced on August 2, 2025. The 5 for 365 photo contest is from June 1st through September 30. Submit your 5 photos by Oct 5th. There will be 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place prizes. Must be signed up for 365 with Dennis Peck. This contest is online only via FB and winners have bragging rights.

Katherine (Director) recognized our photographers' efforts during the R2P Event.

Katherine (Director) briefed LOH Clarke for Corrina (LOH) a co-ed bingo event for August.

Members attending: 98.

July:

Greg (Treasurer) Initiated discussion of future year R2P seed money possibly 2029. It was decided to keep remaining R2P proceeds fenced for 2029.

Katherine (Director) Briefed on Accident Scene Management - registration deadline is tomorrow. Possible combine July & August classes since there wasn't enough interest to fill a class. IMHOG will absorb the \$24 Pay Pal fees if funds need to be refunded.

Bob (Assistant Director) briefed Patriot Thunder was a success with 388 bikes parked. Our chapter won the \$1,000 from our sponsor for the most attendees (11). 388 bikes participated. He went on to brief about the Warm Lake Ride free lunch surprise ride. When questioned about how the ride was selected, all day rides for the year were entered in a random drawing. Only three people knew the resulting selection. The selection was announced to the chapter on the day of the ride.

Shannon (Editor) announced Kathy da Rosa will take over as Editor for 2026. She will begin training with Shannon this upcoming month.

General Meeting: Brett (Lead Road Captain) presented Christyl Boyce with her Road Captain Rocker as she successfully completed the road captain ride to Hagerman for lunch. Congratulations to Christyl. Brett also briefed that the chapter can no longer stage or park motorcycles in the Majestic parking lot for any of our rides until further notice.

August:

John Tessin (R2P Organizer) provided a review of the R2P event. Overall, there was \$41,000 income, \$35,500 expenses, bringing a \$5,600 profit. The R2P Committee requests \$2,000 to a line item in the budget for future R2P hosting in 2029. There was a unanimous motion to place funds in reserve for 2029 hosting. Also, the R2P Steering Committee brings to the board recommendations for the balance of the profit.

Marcia (Activities) addressed who should determine when we stop cooking at events. Moving forward, the decision on when to quit cooking and service will be made between Marcia and Margie (Food Safety).

Wayne (Food Safety) announced Margie Linsky is taking over as Food Safety Officer.

General Meeting: Shannon (Editor) thanked all the members for their support during her tenure as Editor for the past six years & introduced Kathy da Rosa as the new monthly newsletter Editor. Kathy mentioned she is excited to implement.

September:

Katherine (Director) briefed Henry Clark (well-known past chapter member and husband of Mary Clark, current member) passed away & Patriot Guard is overseeing the service. Staging is happening at High Desert H-D. Bikes line up by Service, and cars line up heading south at the west end of High Desert H-D. Discussion regarding staging location, and Dennis confirmed that we line up next to the service department.

Shannon (Editor) led a discussion on adding Past Director Officer board position. She proposed how other chapters utilize the position for guidance to incoming board members, involved with prior year's annual audit, membership follow-up and phone calls, and engaged the membership in newsletter articles. Motion approved to add the optional Past Director board position to the bylaws, effective 2026.

Bob (Assistant Director) proposed Sargent at Arms Position – Some duties may include introduction of the Director at the beginning of the meeting, addressing disruptive persons, providing event security, and counting the election votes. Shannon (Editor) voiced that the position needs a clear definition. A comprehensive and detailed discussion. As a result, this position will be taken under advisement and tabled for a couple of months as members observe activities during upcoming meetings. Bob also recommended that the ACCP event announcement date is earlier in the year so membership can set plans for the event. There was a discussion on the request for an increase in funding for the prizes. Motion approved, a \$500 increase in the \$7,000 budget to \$7,500 for ACCP.

General Meeting:

Bob (Assistant Director) revealed next year's ACCP theme. The HOGS in Paradise Theme reveal is a big hit! The party will be held at the Nampa Civic Center on January 10th, 2026. A block of rooms is available at a discounted rate next door at Best Western Peppertree.

Jeff and Anna (Photographers) announced Shannan Bate won the photo contest.

Dawn (Membership) reported there was a great turnout for the New Member Orientation held on September 13.

October:

Katherine (Director) briefed Curt Van Hooser, the Director of Sierra Thunder Chapter in Folsom and member of the Bay Area Directors (BAD), was killed in a motorcycle accident. A card from our Chapter for his wife, Cyndee Van Hooser, is going around to be signed.

Dennis (HOG Manager) and Mark Dukes (Sponsor) updated group on Ride 365 – we are currently in the second position at 681,325 for the West Region & 11th in the nation. Dennis praised the membership as a whole and raised a hurtful concern that he previously brought

to the Board, to Mark, and to Dennis. Membership has dropped from 334 this time last year to 319 members today. This chapter is not the place for political (CA jokes), religion or where did you come from. The purpose of this group is to ride and have fun.

Katherine (Director) requested more information on what exactly the problem is. We cannot fix what we do not know is broken. Mark Dukes recommends tightening it up as a group, ride & have fun, and buy Harleys.

Discussion between various members present at the meeting voiced their concerns and opinions on a handful of topics that need further attention: inclusivity for new members, ensuring members have way back from a ride, new member orientation, and buddy up with existing members, fellowshipping at the General Meeting vs grouping up. Dawn Renn, Membership Officer, will spearhead a small group to review the new member inclusivity process and provide recommendations to the board.

Bob (Assistant Director) announced there will be a Sgt of Arms next year. Katherine (Director) confirmed that there is a part of the bylaws that provides the Director with the authority to make certain position board appointments unilaterally. Discussion of added clarity to the duties and purpose of the position.

Katherine (Director) briefed the 2024 Ride 365 Pizza Party (provided by Natl HOG rep Chris Harrison) for being #1 in the NW Region is not scheduled but will be after November.

Brett (Lead Road Captain) briefed the Road Captain Appreciation luncheon is scheduled. A request for a \$250 increase to \$1,00 total, in the RC Appreciation lunch budget line item based on the cost of living & additional road captains. 32 road captains. Motion approved for the increase.

R2P Update – John Tessin (R2P) proposed a movie theatre event as a thank you to chapter members for event efforts. BoDo Cinema Screen Wild HOG \$1,750 on November 12th (Wild HOG Wednesday) for the 1st 120 IMHOG Chapter Members registered. Motion approved for up to \$2500 for the event.

General Meeting:

Katherine (Director) briefed the R2P Committee invites all HOG members to register for a free viewing of the Wild Hog movie event November 12th. Attendees will receive \$5 towards a concession purchase.
