HOG MILEAGE RECOGNITION PROGRAM – RIDE 365

PLEASE NOTE: SUBMIT YOUR MILEAGE AND HOG NUMBER AS SOON AS POSSIBLE TO GET THE YEAR STARTED!

Ride 365 is the Official Mileage Recognition Program for H.O.G., the official riding club of Harley-Davidson. Ride 365 includes Lifetime Recognition, Annual Recognition and an annual Chapter Challenge program that measures total chapter miles and average per-member miles. For the lifetime and annual programs, any H.O.G. member can participate. For the Chapter Challenge, if the member is listed as a chapter member in the H.O.G. system, their mileage readings will automatically be added to the chapter challenge. This should encourage our Intermountain H.O.G. members to focus on the reason we own H-D motorcycles—to ride them!

Complete the attached **RIDE 365 Form** and take it to High Desert Harley-Davidson and see Dennis in the Service Department anytime Tuesday through Thursday to get your mileage verified.

Dennis will also do a free safety inspection on your bike while you are there so please plan on about 15 minutes. No appointment necessary. If he is with a customer, please be patient.

You can also email the form, pictures of your odometer, and the VIN for your bike to dennis@highdeserthd.com. Be sure you include your National HOG member number. Click on this link or see the attached form for [RIDE 365 Form](#).

Another benefit of being an Intermountain HOG member – There is no charge for installation when you purchase your motorcycle tires through the SERVICE DEPARTMENT.

Passing As a Group on the Interstate

As our HOG chapter has become larger and the rides are becoming ever more popular, we would like to address an issue that sometimes arises when we are traveling in large groups on the interstate system.


The issue arises when the lead motorcycle changes lanes to pass and the entire group simultaneously moves into the passing lane. This results in our group occupying the passing lane for an extended period of time. At 80 MPH we cover 118 ft. per second and if you are following the motorcycle directly in front of you at a recommended four second interval there is 472 ft. between the two bikes. In a group of thirty motorcycles, which is not uncommon for our HOG group, the distance between the lead bike and the sweep is a little over one mile. At freeway speeds the time required for the entire group to pass one vehicle could be several minutes.

One of issues created by occupying the passing lane for this extended period of time is that faster vehicles attempt to pass our group using the right hand lane and crowd into the formation creating a dangerous and unsafe situation. Another issue created is that “cagers” becoming upset and this just adds more fuel to the fire of why some folks in the general public dislike motorcycle groups. I know many riders say “To Hell with the Cagers and their feelings” but as a HOG organization we always try to take the high road and do the right thing.

The recommended change is to pass on the interstate exactly the same way you would pass on a two lane road with opposing traffic: Stay in your lane until you reach the vehicle you are over taking, accelerate to pass, getting around the vehicle quickly, and maintain the increased speed to make room for the bikes behind you so they are not hanging out in the fast lane any longer than necessary.

We know that “Rome wasn’t built in a day” and changing riding habits take time so have patience with each other as we move forward. Ride safe, keep your head on a swivel, and most importantly “Have Fun!”


Current method of group passing on the interstate.

THE RAY CARDER MEMORIAL RIDE FOR PROSTRATE CANCER AWARENESS

Sunday, April 3, 2022

How surprising unexpected adverse elements of a planned ride led to an exceptional day's riding experience.

First, it was 34 degrees that morning which quickly raised to 40 to 50 to 60 degrees. The sky was clear, sunny and blue with as beautiful day one could ever hope for.



I was expecting only 20 HOG members and 46 showed with 5 new riders needing to sign waivers (51 one total).

I had well-coordinated reservations for 20-30 riders at our restaurant of choice with a large private room for ourselves. Morning of ride, just prior to departure, called restaurant to give them our rider count: "No room for you, not even for 10 riders." By CB I alerted the formation of the situation that awaited us in Emmett: "No room at the inn for us". (Note: I said to myself: "Don't worry Joe, this all will work out.")

The pre-ride paid big dividends, we knew the traffic lights from HDHD to Middleton would try to divide up our formation of 23 two wheels (12 were road glides) and 18 trikes. Our CBs and its proper use would save our bacon 🍖 in maintaining awareness of ride formation's integrity while enabling us to make two "perfect" two lane turns at Chinden and State.

We had one bike break down (a malfunctioning clutch) of one of our Mids, but our Sweep went into "action". Addressed the "clutch level" issue and they were back on the road. We had addressed at our pre-ride briefing: "in case of emergencies"...the Sweep's role. Down one Mid, our well experienced club road captains, along for the ride, quickly filled in the void.

Great, great ride! Roads were clean and the formation's traveling speed was spot on. We arrived at the preplanned restaurant adjacent parking lot in one piece with our Mid and Sweep arriving just five minutes or so afterwards.

I had hoped the restaurant we had planned to eat at may have made appropriate accommodations but the answer we got was still : "No room for you!".

I addressed the issues with our 51 riders who were excited about just having a great ride. We decide to divide and conquer: they broke up into smaller groups to visits other eateries in Emmett.

There a is phenomenon, “I don’t know we’re they are going but I going too”! Eighteen bikes/trikes lead by Mason Clarke went to the Mexican Restaurant in Horseshoe Bend, Sonora. With no advance notice of our sudden arrival, we were met warm patron smiles, great hospitality, and terrific meals along with amazing customer service.

Many thanks to my road captains: Sharon Cardona, Linda Potts, and Bob Potts along with again, Mason Clarke (who did an equally great job as Lead for the second ride).

One final note: the joy and fellowship seen at our club’s first ride was indescribable. We are well off to a “great” riding season ahead.



A Life Flight Network Membership relieves you from liability for out-of-pocket costs of emergent, medically necessary transports completed and billed by Life Flight Network. Your membership is not an insurance policy but secondary to insurance carriers and health care cost sharing programs. All available insurances will be billed first including health, auto, workers compensation and third-party insurance. Life Flight Network will accept payment from insurance carriers and other third party payers as payment in full.

Membership benefits are available for those eligible household members listed on the member record at the time of transport if the transport is an emergent, medically necessary transport to the closest, most appropriate facility, performed by Life Flight Network, its contracted agents, or reciprocal partners, subject to the reciprocal program's rules.

Membership benefits are extended to the primary member, his/her spouse or domestic partner and dependents claimed on their income tax return. Dependents must be added to the member record within 30 days of birth or adoption. Elderly (age 65+) and disabled family members living in the same household are also covered. Life Flight Network may require documentation or other verification of membership eligibility.

Emergency medical transports are based on medical need, not membership status. Medical need can only be determined by a physician, EMS provider, hospital or another qualified third-party recognized by Medicare, and is in all cases subject to the final determination of the health insurance carrier, if any. Non-emergent transports are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership benefits.

Availability of service cannot be guaranteed due to weather conditions, maintenance, commitment to another transport, out-of-service equipment and other reasons.

New and lapsed membership benefits take effect 72 hours after receipt of a completed enrollment with payment.

Membership fees are non-refundable, non-transferable and are not tax-deductible. Life Flight Network may cease selling and servicing memberships should any governmental body, now or in the future, determine memberships can no longer be offered within their jurisdiction. No refunds will be made for any memberships already purchased.

I transfer directly to Life Flight Network my rights to insurance payments due to me for services provided by Life Flight Network. Such payments shall not exceed Life Flight Network's regular charges. Denial of a claim by an insurance provider must be received by Life Flight Network in writing. Membership benefits do not extend to transports deemed not medically necessary or when insurers deny payments due to coordination of benefit issues. Per government regulations, individuals covered by Medicaid are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership and should not apply.

I specifically release and waive any and all rights, claims or causes of action against Life Flight Network and its employees and agents with respect to my Life Flight Network Membership.
