Ride 365 includes Lifetime Recognition, Annual Recognition and an annual Chapter Challenge program that measures total chapter miles and average per-member miles. 

### **Training Opportunities Available For You**

As we begin another riding season there is no better time to knock the rust off of your riding skills that may have accumulated over the winter. Whether you are new to riding or have been setting in the saddle for forty years, we all have room to improve our riding skills or to break bad habits we may have picked up over the years.



Our local HD dealer has a "Learn to Ride" program <https://learntorideidaho.com/> with sessions available for beginners up to the season rider as does Idaho STAR <https://idahostar.org/>

Having to perform slow speed maneuvers around vehicles in parking lots or making a U-turn in the width of a highway while on a ride can cause increased stress in some riders. It has been said anyone can ride a motorcycle at high speeds but the slow speed maneuvers are also essential in keeping yourself safe. The session you may be interested in is called "Next Level" and it will help instill slow speed skills and show ways to overcome the apprehension that may occur when having to perform these maneuvers. There is no test required to complete this course.

Research tells us that over 80% of fatal motorcycle crashes involve untrained and unendorsed riders in our state. Despite all the advice many riders believe that training for them is unnecessary. They believe that they already possess all the necessary riding skills to operate their motorcycle safely. Training, however teaches more than just physical skills. Training teaches mental subtleties, quick reactions, good judgement, correct choices, and proper attitude. These traits and more, are essential to our survival in a world that seems out to get us. Riding skills are considered "perishable" and I can personally attest to this.

Jamie and I take training courses every spring and I will tell you that at the beginning of each course I am quite shaky but by the end of the day my riding is so much smoother. In fact, some think that if experienced riders haven't taken an advanced training course within the last three years, their skills may have deteriorated to the point of not having ever been trained. It is a rare, if not unheard-of, occurrence that taking a course doesn't teach a new skill or reveal a bad habit. Being trained and practicing these skills during the riding season assures that a rider will have the necessary skills at that moment of truth. So, it seems that we would be best served to do something in our own best interest.

A benefit to being H.O.G. members is that you are eligible for tuition reimbursement in the form of a voucher for up to \$50 for the successful completion of a course. When signing up

for a training course through HDHD's Learn to Ride Program, be sure and let Brian Eichler know you are a H.O.G. member so you can receive this benefit. In other words, the Next Level course has a cost of \$95 and with the reimbursement from H.O.G you can take a high-quality training session taught by certified instructors for only \$45.

If twelve or more IMHC members sign up and complete any of the training courses in a calendar year, the chapter will receive from H.O.G a plaque noting this accomplishment and the plaques are available for viewing in our display cases at the dealership.

I challenge you to take a riders training course sometime during this riding season. In fact, I would like to see if we can generate enough interest that we could fill one class with just HOG riders.

Thank you to Lane Triplett for contributing to this article. Ride safe, keep your head on a swivel, but most importantly "Have Fun!"

## ***CHAPTER EVENT RELEASE FORM FOR MINOR INFORMATION***

Each year our chapter has the opportunity to participate in Regional Officer's Connection (ROC) Training. One take away from this year's event was the clarification of who is allowed to sign a release form for a minor participating in chapter rides.

The "Chapter Event Release Form for Minors" specifies that the "parent or guardian" must sign the form. The term "guardian" has been clarified to mean "legal guardian". Legal guardianship can only be assigned by a court, such as the family court, according to state laws.

If you're bringing a minor to one of our chapter rides, and you are not the parent or guardian of the minor, you must present a "Chapter Event Release Form for Minors" signed by the parent or guardian to the Lead Road Captain. Forms can be found on our website, [www.intermountainhog.com](http://www.intermountainhog.com), hit the "H.O.G. Riders" tab at the top. From there go to "Chapter Group Rides" then scroll down to "Road Captain Resources" where you will find the form or use the link below.

# STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

By becoming a Life Flight Network Member, you agree to the terms stated below.

A Life Flight Network Membership relieves you from liability for out-of-pocket costs of emergent, medically necessary transports completed and billed by Life Flight Network. Your membership is not an insurance policy but secondary to insurance carriers and health care cost sharing programs. All available insurances will be billed first including health, auto, workers compensation and third-party insurance. Life Flight Network will accept payment from insurance carriers and other third party payers as payment in full.

Membership benefits are available for those eligible household members listed on the member record at the time of transport if the transport is an emergent, medically necessary transport to the closest, most appropriate facility, performed by Life Flight Network, its contracted agents, or reciprocal partners, subject to the reciprocal program's rules.

Membership benefits are extended to the primary member, his/her spouse or domestic partner and dependents claimed on their income tax return. Dependents must be added to the member record within 30 days of birth or adoption. Elderly (age 65+) and disabled family members living in the same household are also covered. Life Flight Network may require documentation or other verification of membership eligibility.

Emergency medical transports are based on medical need, not membership status. Medical need can only be determined by a physician, EMS provider, hospital or another qualified third-party recognized by Medicare, and is in all cases subject to the final determination of the health insurance carrier, if any.

Non-emergent transports are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership benefits.

Availability of service cannot be guaranteed due to weather conditions, maintenance, commitment to another transport, out-of-service equipment, and other reasons.

New and lapsed membership benefits take effect upon receipt of a completed enrollment with payment.

Membership fees are non-refundable, non-transferable and are not tax-deductible. Life Flight Network may cease selling and servicing memberships should any governmental body, now or in the future, determine memberships can no longer be offered within their jurisdiction. No refunds will be made for any memberships already purchased.

**I transfer directly to Life Flight Network my rights to insurance payments due to me for services provided by Life Flight Network.** Such payments shall not exceed Life Flight Network's regular charges. Denial of a claim by an insurance provider must be received by Life Flight Network in writing. Membership benefits do not extend to transports deemed not medically necessary or when insurers deny payments due to coordination of benefit issues. Per government regulations, individuals covered by Medicaid are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership and should not apply.
