Greetings to my fellow HOG members,



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## PRIMARY OFFICERS NOMINATIONS TO BE HELD IN OCTOBER

October is the month the Chapter holds nominations for Assistant Director, Treasurer, and Secretary for the next year. If you are interested in being nominated please attend the October meeting. At the December 1st "Friendsgiving" General Meeting we will vote for the four primary officers. The other Board positions are appointed by the incoming Chapter Director and the Sponsoring Dealer. If you have been an Intermountain Chapter member for at least one year and are interested in serving in one of those positions please contact John Tessin or David Kesner.

The following are excerpts from our Chapter By-Laws and provide descriptions of all board positions. If you have any questions about a position on the board, please contact any current board member. Full copy of the By-laws are available on the Chapter website/Members Only page.

### ***ARTICLE V: BOARD OF DIRECTORS - Section 3.***

In order to be eligible to be nominated/appointed to hold any of the offices referred to in Section 7 of this Article, a member:

- Shall be required to have been a member in continuous good standing in this organization for the twelve (12) calendar months immediately prior to election/appointment;
- Shall not hold an office or an administrative position in any similar motorcycle organization;
- Shall agree to observe, conform, and comply to all terms and provisions of these by-laws and the H.O.G. Chapter Charter where applicable, and all rules, regulations, practices, and lawful orders and decisions adopted and promulgated in the furtherance and administration of said by-laws and charter.

### ***ARTICLE V: BOARD OF DIRECTORS - Section 7: Duties of Elected Officers:***

#### ***A. CHAPTER DIRECTOR***

- The Chapter Director shall be the chief executive officer of this organization and he or she shall have responsibility for the overall conduct of the organization's affairs. He or she shall be authorized to carry out his or her responsibilities personally or by deputy. He or she shall be responsible to ensure the chapter up holds and abides by the H.O.G. Chapter Charter and Chapter By-Laws.
- The Chapter Director shall receive reports from all representatives of this organization and shall make reports to the membership as appropriate. The Chapter Director shall have authority to employ such technical, administrative, and clerical assistance as shall be necessary for the affairs of this organization, subject to approval of the Board of Directors.

- The Chapter Director shall have the authority, when he or she deems necessary between meetings of the Board of Directors, to conduct a poll of the board by telephone, fax, and email or by mail.
- The Chapter Director shall convene a meeting of the Board of Directors at such times as it is deemed necessary for the purpose of conducting the business of the organization. The Chapter Director shall preside over all sessions of the Board of Directors as its Chairman. He or she shall also call a meeting of the board when requested to do so by any two members of the board.
- The Chapter Director shall conduct chapter meetings and be the principal spokesperson of this organization on all matters pertaining to this organization and its members in relation to H.O.G. However, the Chapter Director could assign these responsibilities to another member of the organization.
- In the event the Executive Committee determines the need for a bond, a bond in such sum as the Board of Director shall determine, or as required by law, to indemnify this organization against financial loss shall be secured.
- The Chapter Director shall insure that the affairs and business of Intermountain Chapter are properly upholding the H.O.G. Chapter Charter and H.O.G. operating policies.
- The Chapter Director shall insure that the provisions of all agreements are enforced and respected by all persons affected or bound thereby. All instances of non-compliance, which are not amicably adjusted, shall be reported to the Executive Committee of this organization.
- The Chapter Director shall have the authority to assign duties and responsibilities to members of Intermountain Chapter as necessary to further the interests of this organization.
- The Chapter Director shall keep the Sponsor of this organization informed on the activities of Intermountain Chapter and, with the Sponsor, ensure the chapter complies with all the corporate state annual filing requirements.
- The Chapter Director shall verify chapter expenditures and deposits by reviewing monthly bank statements either electronically on-line or by hard-copy.

#### ***B. ASSISTANT CHAPTER DIRECTOR***

- The Assistant Director shall assist the Sponsor and Chapter Director in upholding the H.O.G. Chapter Charter and Chapter By-Laws.
- In the absence of the Chapter Director at any regular or special meeting of the Intermountain Chapter, the Assistant Director shall perform the functions and duties of the Chapter Director, or as otherwise directed to do so by the Chapter Director.
- The Assistant Director shall have administrative responsibility over chapter events. He or she shall have the authority to assign duties and responsibilities to members of Intermountain Chapter relative to chapter events.

- The Assistant Director shall, with members of the Board of Directors, inform the membership of the chapter of H.O.G. programs and benefits.

### ***C. SECRETARY***

- The Secretary shall have the responsibility of taking minutes of all Intermountain Chapter meetings. He or she shall maintain copies of the minutes of all meetings and shall have custody of such minutes as part of the records of this organization.
- The Secretary shall be responsible for all correspondence on behalf of the chapter which includes chapter incorporation and maintaining a file of insurance and waiver forms for chapter activities.
- The Secretary shall be responsible for receiving and responding to original requests for charitable donations, receiving applications, and submitting them to the Board of Directors for review.

### ***D. TREASURER***

- All monies payable to Intermountain Chapter shall be turned over to the Treasurer, who shall prepare and dispense a proper receipt.
- The Treasurer shall make and keep a proper record of all such monies received and deposit within ten (10) working days, in the name of Intermountain Chapter in such bank(s) and depositories as the Executive Committee shall determine.
- The Treasurer shall at each Board of Directors meeting of the Intermountain Chapter, provide a detailed written financial report of the monies received and disbursed since his or her last report and provide a copy of the report to the sponsor. All officers and members shall have the right to review this document, by making a request through the Board of Directors.
- The Treasurer shall submit his or her books to the Executive Committee of Intermountain Chapter and Sponsoring Dealer for inspection upon request of the Executive Committee.
- The Treasurer shall keep a true and accurate record of all financial transactions of Intermountain Chapter.
- The Treasurer shall oversee preparation of chapter tax returns.
- Those seeking responsibilities of Treasurer shall have experience with general accounting practices and is encouraged to have knowledge of financial software.

As Intermountain Chapter H.O.G. members you receive 2 points for every \$1.00 you spend at High Desert Harley-Davidson. Veterans and First Responders are entitled to 3 points for every \$1.00 spent, but you must make your status known and enroll at the dealership to receive this benefit. Then you go online to the Associates/Passenger HOG National account to retrieve a \$30 voucher to redeem either online at Harley Davidson or High Desert Harley-Davidson. **NOTE:** They will not send you a notification! 

### ***Group Riding in our HOG Chapter***

As our chapter continues to grow and riders from many different backgrounds, experience levels, as well as other HOG chapters join in, it has recently come to the attention of the board that not everyone knows or understands how we, in the Intermountain HOG ride as a group.



Our standard formation for open roads is the “staggered” formation where each rider is directly behind the rider in front of them but offset from the rider in the opposite lane position. The rule of thumb is that you maintain a 2-second distance from the rider directly in front of you leaving room to maneuver if an emergency should arise or sudden braking should become necessary. This following distance can increase as the speed increases but should never be less than 2-seconds.

When we enter mountain roads with curves or the road narrows to a point staggered riding is no longer feasible, we transition to a “single file” formation where one rider follows directly behind the rider in front of them leaving the 2-second interval. This shift is indicated by the lead road captain raising one finger over their head and the hand signals are to be passed back from rider to rider throughout the entire formation. Inversely when a staggered formation is once again feasible, the lead road captain will indicate this by raising two fingers over their head and the signal should be passed back from rider to rider throughout the entire formation.

It is the rider’s responsibility to maintain this following distance and personally I use the method when the bike or the shadow of the bike directly in front of me crosses something visible in the road, i.e., crack, tar snake, painted line, and begin to count one thousand one, one thousand two. This works fairly well and after some time you will be able to judge the distance just by sight.

There are a couple of rules in riding with our HOG chapter as a group that must be adhered to regardless of the situation inside the formation:


1. We never pass another rider while the formation is in motion; no matter how slow others are riding, if there is too much of a gap between them and the bike in front, or if you just want to ride with your buddy. Not only could the rider or riders you are passing become spooked as they are not expecting it, it is also a good way to piss off a lot of your fellow riders. The place to make changes in the formation is at the next scheduled stop. If you feel that you absolutely need to

change positions within the formation, then contact the lead road captain once the group has come to a rest stop.

2. We do not adjust our lane position once the group is in motion. This results in everyone behind you playing musical motorcycles and making potentially dangerous lane changes. Once again, the place to make changes in the formation is at the next scheduled stop. If you feel the absolute need to change positions within the formation then contact the lead road captain once the group has come to a rest stop.

If you still have questions or concerns about group riding in our HOG chapter please contact our director John Tessin, our lead road captain Cliff Lewis, myself, or any of the road captains for more information.

Ride safe, keep your head on a swivel, but most importantly “Have Fun!”

We all want a ride that gets from point A to point B safely and free of drama. With that in mind, our new members are provided with information on safe rider skills that our chapter have come to expect. Use of these skills on every ride, in every position of the riding group can, and does, provide a more relaxed and comforting experience for all of us.

Show your Harley some love also, to stay ahead of the road gremlins. See you on the road. Ride on, Ride Safe!

### *An Intermountain HOG Chapter Ride Protocol Reminder*

If you are joining a Chapter ride at a scheduled stopping point along the ride, there are a couple of pointers you should remember:

1. It is the rider or group of riders' responsibility to let the Lead Road Captain know **in advance** that you will be joining the ride along the route so they can pass this information along to the other road captains.
2. It is the rider or group of riders' responsibility to seek out the Lead Road Captain when the main group arrives. This is done so each individual can be signed in on the attendance roster as a ride participant for legal and insurance purposes before joining the ride.
3. Each rider must be briefed on the ride by the Lead Road Captain before joining the ride.
4. It is the responsibility of the rider or group of riders to join the main formation once it arrives and not to wait until the group is ready to depart from the stop. This makes mingling into the main group and setting up the stagger much easier.
5. Contacting the Lead Road Captain once the main group arrives assists in the tally of the bikes/trikes for our HOG ride records.

These issues primarily arises when the meeting point is a popular location where other riding groups gather to begin their rides. It is difficult for the Lead Road Captain to know who are the HOG Riders and who are from other organizations.

With these points in mind, the Lead Road Captain is assured everyone is signed in, accounted for, and ready to proceed for the remainder of the ride.

#### **CHAPTER RELEASE FORM FOR MINORS AND MINOR'S ASSUMPTION OF RISK INFORMATION**

**Clarification** – National H.O.G. requires a minor's parent or guardian to sign a **Chapter Release Form for Minors EVERYTIME THEY RIDE**, and if they are over 12 years old, the minor must sign a **Minor's Assumption Form EVERYTIME THEY RIDE**. This applies if the minor is a Chapter member or not.

The term "guardian" has been clarified to mean "legal guardian". Legal guardianship can only be assigned by a court, such as the family court, according to state laws.

If you're bringing a minor to one of our chapter rides, and you are not the parent or guardian of the minor, you must present a "Chapter Event Release Form for Minors" signed by the parent or guardian to the Lead Road Captain. Forms can be found on our website, [www.intermountainhog.com](http://www.intermountainhog.com), hit the "H.O.G. Riders" tab at the top. From there go to "Chapter Group Rides" then scroll down to "Road Captain Resources" where you will find the form or use the link below.

# STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

By becoming a Life Flight Network Member, you agree to the terms stated below.

A Life Flight Network Membership relieves you from liability for out-of-pocket costs of emergent, medically necessary transports completed and billed by Life Flight Network. Your membership is not an insurance policy but secondary to insurance carriers and health care cost sharing programs. All available insurances will be billed first including health, auto, workers compensation and third-party insurance. Life Flight Network will accept payment from insurance carriers and other third party payers as payment in full.

Membership benefits are available for those eligible household members listed on the member record at the time of transport if the transport is an emergent, medically necessary transport to the closest, most appropriate facility, performed by Life Flight Network, its contracted agents, or reciprocal partners, subject to the reciprocal program's rules.

Membership benefits are extended to the primary member, his/her spouse or domestic partner and dependents claimed on their income tax return. Dependents must be added to the member record within 30 days of birth or adoption. Elderly (age 65+) and disabled family members living in the same household are also covered. Life Flight Network may require documentation or other verification of membership eligibility.

Emergency medical transports are based on medical need, not membership status. Medical need can only be determined by a physician, EMS provider, hospital or another qualified third-party recognized by Medicare, and is in all cases subject to the final determination of the health insurance carrier, if any.

Non-emergent transports are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership benefits.

Availability of service cannot be guaranteed due to weather conditions, maintenance, commitment to another transport, out-of-service equipment, and other reasons.

New and lapsed membership benefits take effect upon receipt of a completed enrollment with payment.

Membership fees are non-refundable, non-transferable and are not tax-deductible. Life Flight Network may cease selling and servicing memberships should any governmental body, now or in the future, determine memberships can no longer be offered within their jurisdiction. No refunds will be made for any memberships already purchased.

**I transfer directly to Life Flight Network my rights to insurance payments due to me for services provided by Life Flight Network.** Such payments shall not exceed Life Flight Network's regular charges. Denial of a claim by an insurance provider must be received by Life Flight Network in writing. Membership benefits do not extend to transports deemed not medically necessary or when insurers deny payments due to coordination of benefit issues. Per government regulations, individuals covered by Medicaid are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership and should not apply.

**I specifically release and waive any and all rights, claims or causes of action against Life Flight Network and its employees and agents with respect to my Life Flight Network Membership.**
