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

Some of us are fair-weathered riders and some choose to ride throughout the winter months. With winter comes the possibility of frostbite.

The temperature outside must be below freezing (32 F or 0 C) for frostbite to develop on exposed skin. The wind chill will not bring the temperature to below freezing when the temperature outside is above freezing, so you would not get frostbite in this scenario.

When frostbite occurs, the water in your skin cells freeze causing both invisible and visible damage to your cells and soft tissues. Frostbite usually affects your fingers, toes, and ears first. It is also possible to get frostbite on your cheeks and chin when your face is exposed. The cold can injure both skin and the tissues underneath such as your muscles, nerves, and joints. You can even get frostbite through clothing! In some situations, you can also get frostbite when your skin is pressed directly on metal or when using cold ice packs for extended periods of time.

Symptoms of frostbite:

- You will feel cold and have a prickling feeling on your skin
- Numbness
- Change in skin color such as red, white, bluish-white, grayish-yellow, purplish, brown or ashen
- Hard or waxy looking skin
- Becoming clumsy due to joint and muscle stiffness

Ways to prevent frostbite when our enjoying our rides:

- Stay indoors when it is cold, or limit the time you are outdoors
- Cover all exposed skin including your face
- Use heated gear when riding
- Wear multiple layers of loose clothing with thermal undergarments
- Your sleeves should fit snugly against your wrist to keep cold air out
- You can add a wind resistant out layer to block the wind
- Use a neck gator or scarf to keep the skin on your neck covered
- Keep dry, wear rain gear, and change out of it as soon as you are able

***Dress for the weather, stay warm, stay dry and most of all  
don't outride your guardian angel!***

All in all, it was another great year for riding in the Chapter. It would have been better without all the smoke, but I guess that's become a way of life. We had 37 Chapter rides this year. I wasn't able to participate in all of them because of my j\_b, but the ones I could go on were awesome. From what I'm told, the rest were too. It doesn't look like we'll hit our million mile goal this year. But, as a wise man once said, "there's always next year".

If you haven't been to see Dennis for a mileage check, there's still time. And remember, you can email or text him a photo of your VIN and odometer if you can't ride in. Please do it by December 21<sup>st</sup> so he has time to get everything entered to the Harley website.

We've reached that point in the year where, in the back of my mind, I start trying to think of new and different rides for the coming year. If you've lived here a while you probably feel like you've ridden everywhere there is to ride around here but, trust me, you haven't. I have been here since 1949 and on at least three rides this year I was on roads I had never seen.

For my almost last official act as Lead Road Captain, I challenge everyone - road captains and general membership - to come up with a new and different chapter ride. Day ride, overnighter, doesn't matter. If you are not a road captain, but think of something, contact a road captain and put something together.

Bidea, bidea, That's all folks! See you at Friendsgiving!

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***An Intermountain HOG Chapter Ride Protocol Reminder***

If you are joining a Chapter ride at a scheduled stopping point along the ride, there are a couple of pointers you should remember:

1. It is the rider or group of riders' responsibility to let the Lead Road Captain know **in advance** that you will be joining the ride along the route so they can pass this information along to the other road captains.
2. It is the rider or group of riders' responsibility to seek out the Lead Road Captain when the main group arrives. This is done so each individual can be signed in on the attendance roster as a ride participant for legal and insurance purposes before joining the ride.
3. Each rider must be briefed on the ride by the Lead Road Captain before joining the ride.
4. It is the responsibility of the rider or group of riders to join the main formation once it arrives and not to wait until the group is ready to depart from the stop. This makes mingling into the main group and setting up the stagger much easier.

These issues primarily arises when the meeting point is a popular location where other riding groups gather to begin their rides. It is difficult for the Lead Road Captain to know who are Chapter riders and who are from other organizations.

With these points in mind, the Lead Road Captain is assured everyone is signed in, accounted for, and ready to proceed for the remainder of the ride.

## CHAPTER RELEASE FORM FOR MINORS AND MINOR'S ASSUMPTION OF RISK INFORMATION

**Clarification** – National H.O.G. requires a minor's parent or guardian to sign a **Chapter Release Form for Minors EVERYTIME THEY RIDE**, and if they are over 12 years old, the minor must sign a **Minor's Assumption Form EVERYTIME THEY RIDE**. This applies if the minor is a Chapter member or not.

The term "guardian" has been clarified to mean "legal guardian". Legal guardianship can only be assigned by a court, such as the family court, according to state laws.

If you're bringing a minor to one of our chapter rides, and you are not the parent or guardian of the minor, you must present a "Chapter Event Release Form for Minors" signed by the parent or guardian to the Lead Road Captain. Forms can be found on our website, [www.intermountainhog.com](http://www.intermountainhog.com), hit the "H.O.G. Riders" tab at the top. From there go to "Chapter Group Rides" then scroll down to "Road Captain Resources" where you will find the form or use the link below.

### *POST-RIDE REPORTS*

#### **SOUTHERN UTAH RIDE 'DOS'**

**September 15-22**

5 trikes, 5 bikes, 15 people, 2500 miles

Our first day on the trip to Utah was from Boise, ID to Ely Nevada. Jamie had a flat tire in Owyhee Nevada, luckily we had a patch kit. We highly recommend you purchase one if you do not have one. We were able to fix her flat in short order and it did not delay the trip. The ride to Elko was more picturesque than I thought, I had never been there before. After our lunch stop in Elko, we proceeded to Ely, Nevada. The town of Ely was full of Corvettes and Porsches as there was apparently a 90-mile road race that they were preparing for. We were able to have conversations with some of the drivers of the cars that night. One driver was going to try to set a new speed record of 250 MPH for the 90 miles.

The next morning we were off to Great Basin National Park, we were at 10,000 ft with our bikes. The Great Basin National Park is a must see. Then we were off on a long lonely ride to St. George. Next morning, Zion National Park. We had two people in front of us at the entrance gate, which is unbelievable, great timing! We took the Mt. Carmel Scenic Byway to Highway 12 to Bryce Canyon National Park and got some great photos in Bryce Canyon. Highway 12, one of the top ten roads to do on a motorcycle in the United States, did not disappoint us. The Camel's Back, a stretch of road on Highway 12, the road drops off 300 feet on both sides with no guard rail. This was an interesting stretch of road. The Highway 12 overlook was close to 10,000 ft in elevation, cold and windy. Then to Torey for the evening. Torey, Utah is the entrance to Capitol Reef National Park. The following morning we had a full rainbow overlooking the hotel as we entered Capitol Reef National Park, stunning ride! Capitol Reef to Mexican Hat was a very picturesque ride. Due to fuel concerns, we ended up taking a short cut to Mexican Hat and ended up riding the Moki Dugway. The Moki Dugway is a switchback gravel road down a 10% grade for three miles. It was a very challenging ride, but we made it. Then to Monticello, Utah for the evening. From Monticello to

Newspaper Rock and then to Moab, Utah. We had lunch at the Red Cliffs Lodge on the Colorado River, a must stop! Then to the Arches National Park, then to Green River for the night. From Green River we went to Fairview, Utah for lunch. From Fairview we went to Lehi, Utah. Next Morning it was the Alpine Loop over the Wasatch Mountains to Taggart's Grill for lunch, an amazing place! Then on to Ogden for the last night's stay. Then we headed home.

Couldn't have asked for a better group to ride with! Great camaraderie, one of the top rides of my life. We accomplished so much, teaching everyone to use the HD App maps. Special Thanks to Brett Allies for all of his work, making this a very successful ride.

**By becoming a Life Flight Network Member, you agree to the terms stated below.**

A Life Flight Network Membership relieves you from liability for out-of-pocket costs of emergent, medically necessary transports completed and billed by Life Flight Network. Your membership is not an insurance policy but secondary to insurance carriers and health care cost sharing programs. All available insurances will be billed first including health, auto, workers compensation and third-party insurance. Life Flight Network will accept payment from insurance carriers and other third party payers as payment in full.

Membership benefits are available for those eligible household members listed on the member record at the time of transport if the transport is an emergent, medically necessary transport to the closest, most appropriate facility, performed by Life Flight Network, its contracted agents, or reciprocal partners, subject to the reciprocal program's rules.

Membership benefits are extended to the primary member, his/her spouse or domestic partner and dependents claimed on their income tax return. Dependents must be added to the member record within 30 days of birth or adoption. Elderly (age 65+) and disabled family members living in the same household are also covered. Life Flight Network may require documentation or other verification of membership eligibility.

Emergency medical transports are based on medical need, not membership status. Medical need can only be determined by a physician, EMS provider, hospital or another qualified third-party recognized by Medicare, and is in all cases subject to the final determination of the health insurance carrier, if any.

Non-emergent transports are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership benefits.

Availability of service cannot be guaranteed due to weather conditions, maintenance, commitment to another transport, out-of-service equipment, and other reasons.

New and lapsed membership benefits take effect upon receipt of a completed enrollment with payment.

Membership fees are non-refundable, non-transferable and are not tax-deductible. Life Flight Network may cease selling and servicing memberships should any governmental body, now or in the future, determine memberships can no longer be offered within their jurisdiction.
